PVA's New Advocacy Network, "PVAction Force"

Paralyzed Veterans of America has launched a new grassroots advocacy network called "PVAction Force". Through PVAction Force, members can take part in petitions, receive important legislative alerts, and learn more about the advocacy efforts of PVA relating to those with spinal cord injuries and diseases, as well as all people with disabilities. Currently, PVA is launching multiple campaigns, from automobile grants to equal access to air travel that members can participate in. For the launch of PVAction Force, a petition has been put together for Congress to pass the Air Carrier Access Amendments Act. While the Air Carrier Access Act was passed 35 years ago, travelers with disabilities continue to face discrimination, including damaged or lost wheelchairs when stowed, limited access to lavatories, and limited access to seating accommodations. We ask that you sign the petition to demand that Congress end the discrimination toward travelers with disabilities and to better provide equal access.
