National Service Officer Report Chris Custer

First and foremost, I hope this finds everyone in good health and spirits. As we move further into the year, I am pleased to report some positive developments for Richmond & Hampton VAMCs.

Due to the steady decline of community transmission rates, Richmond & Hampton VAMCs are now operating on MEDIUM health protection level. This drop from high to medium has brought some policy changes such as optional masking throughout the hospital <u>unless</u> you are within the SCI/D Center. Check-in for Covid screening is still in effect before entering SCI/D. In Richmond, there are floor markers and wall signs serving as reminders for people entering and walking through the halls to remain masked. Visitors are authorized, but only 2 per patient is requested due to limited space in rooms and the need to maintain social distancing. Currently, the Richmond SCI/D entrance is still closed-off, but I am keeping a pulse on this issue and will be updating everyone as soon as the entrance is reopened.

PVA Site Visits to Richmond & Hampton VAMCs were conducted in March and the overall reports for both were positive. We had many fruitful discussions regarding topics like changing COVID policies, resuming our Mid-Atlantic Chapter events, luncheons, outings, etc. within both hospitals, and the impact this pandemic has had on providers and patients. Both Richmond & Hampton staff members and veterans are excited to have Mid-Atlantic Chapter onsite again soon.

Lastly, H.R. 7939 – Veterans Auto and Education Improvement Act of 2022 was enacted when signed by President Biden on January 5, 2023. This law aims to provide additional benefits and support for veterans in two key areas: auto loans and education. It will expand veteran access to affordable auto loans by the Dept. of VA and make improvements to veteran education benefits. Now that this bill is law, VA is working on creating the parameters for implementing these legislative changes. I will be tracking this process and maintaining communication with the Prosthetics Departments regarding timelines. As I know more, I will keep everyone up to date.

Hope this has been a helpful update and I will be following up on these issues for you as I know more.

OUR WEEK ON CAPITOL HILL BY JESSIE OLIFF



Two years of Zoom is behind us and we were back in-person, and what a week it was in Washington D.C. Our Mid-Atlantic Advocacy & Legislation Team spent the first 2 days attending PVA's Legislative Seminar where our National Government Relations staff educated us on the priorities to share with our elected officials. We heard presentations from the U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs, U.S. Dept. of Transportation, U.S. Dept. of Health & Human Services and the Office of Aviation Consumer Protection.

It was then time to spend 2 days at the Capitol for scheduled meetings with our members of Congress from Virginia and North Carolina. Along with Amy McKee, Johnny Holland and Jackie Jones, Jr., we represented each of you during face-to-face meetings with our legislators where we stressed many important issues facing our members, including:

- Protecting access to VA's specialized health care services
- Expanding access to long-term health care support and services
- Improving VA benefits for our members and your families
- Protecting the civil rights of people with disabilities
