After being encouraged years ago to join our chapter by long standing member Jimmy May, Mr. Hartney says that he feels the most gratified by paying forward - reaching-out and supporting other Veterans and sharing his experiences. When asked what he appreciates the most about being a chapter leader, Mr. Hartney says, "The biggest part is listening to our members and trying to meet their needs, whether it's from a medical point of view or through recreational activities." He has highlighted advocacy for Veterans and those with disabilities as both an interest and passion of his.

The first Mid-Atlantic Chapter event he recalls participating in was our bass fishing tournament, and it opened his eyes to something that surprised him. "The members are far more diverse than I ever imagined, which is a good thing! They're great people to be around, to have fun with, and to work with."

Mr. Hartney is proud of the success and growth of our chapter, and hopes for more of both. "I'd like to see the organization get bigger in terms of numbers. Our financial situation is quite healthy for an organization of this size. Our goal is to keep it healthy and at the same time, continue to strengthen and support the needs of all of our members."

A retired U.S. Army pilot who flew B-52's, Mr. Hartney is the chief instructor of a flight school based in Newport News, VA. When he is not spending time at home or traveling with his wife MeLissa, he enjoys remaining as active as possible, including competitive wheelchair basketball and wheelchair golf - and spending a lot of time at Madison Square Garden cheering on his New York Knicks and New York Rangers.

Tom Johnson has been active with PVA since 2015, but to say that PVA is the extent of his activity would be a tremendous understatement. Mr. Johnson is non-stop when it comes to being the best he can be. The U.S. Army Veteran and proud member of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter has always been passionate about writing and is taking his love for the written word to the next level. Next up for Mr. Johnson is completing his Master of Arts degree in fiction writing. He was recently accepted into the fine arts program at the New School in New York City, where he will begin in the fall.

Mr. Johnson shared insights into his journey on how he became involved with our chapter. He first learned of the work we do when he was transitioning out of the Army and was in search of disability benefits. He was introduced to a PVA National Service Officer who helped him with the paperwork and exam scheduling, and this experience left a lasting, positive impression. Notably, upon exiting the military, he sought assistance from PVA after realizing the importance of the other work we do. He has since become a strong advocate for PVA, saying, "If any Veteran asks for information about services to help them, I refer them to PVA."

Expressing gratitude for PVA's support, Mr. Johnson highlighted the many ways in which our chapter has aided his life. "I wish more people knew that you operate as counselors and liaisons", he said. "Any questions I ask about my status, my case, etc., I can trust that PVA will thoroughly look at my paperwork for me. People don't realize there are agencies that do this. PVA has been the kindest."

Prior to joining the Army, Mr. Johnson graduated from the University of Texas (Austin) in 2008. He served as a lieutenant for several years. Mr. Johnson currently resides in the DC area, holding a civilian position with the government that he has held for 7 years. He has also received a master's degree from Johns Hopkins University, funded by the GI bill.

We are proud of Mr. Johnson's many achievements, and proud to support him along with each of our 800+ Mid-Atlantic Chapter members.

#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR RICHMOND

## **National Service Officer**



As we welcome the vibrant colors and renewed energy of spring, I want to take this opportunity to share some updates from our office here in the Richmond SCI/D Center.

First, we are happy to announce the construction phase(s) for the SCI/D Expansion Project are continuing and we are noticing visible progress being made. There was a significant delay regarding an issue with room design, but with the support of Mid-Atlantic Chapter Board Members, Executive Director Ivan Schwartz and PVA Medical Services, we successfully advocated

for this to be rectified promptly and for construction to resume. Within this phase, the addition of a 15-bed unit is anticipated to be opened by Summer 2024. These additional beds will allow for more veterans to receive SCI/D inpatient care and ideally reduce the ever-growing list of veteran transfers awaiting an available bed within the Richmond SCI/D Center.

Secondly, at the beginning of this year, many PVA members expressed issues with the Richmond SCI/D designated parking lot being severely reduced in available parking spots. As a result, this reduction created significant delays for veterans who depend upon this lot for easier access to their appointments, and in some cases, causing them to miss their appointments entirely. We advocated for the lot to be restored to full capacity as required by the VHA Parking Design Manual, and almost all of the spots have since been returned. If you utilize this lot and experience parking issues which negatively impact your ability to make your appointments on time or at all, please share your experiences and this will be addressed at our upcoming PVA Annual Site Visit.

Lastly, as we embrace this season of renewal, I want to take this time to encourage PVA members to reflect on any goals or resolutions you may have made for this new year. As we're almost ¼ of the way through 2024, I want to provide this reminder that there is still time to accomplish any goals or resolutions you have set for yourself. For me, I am reminded of my resolution to practice more patience and my goal of improving my physical fitness and overall health this year. Whatever this may look like for you, let this serve as encouragement to continue putting in the effort towards achieving the goals and/or resolutions you have set for yourself in 2024.

I hope you have a spring filled with growth, progress, and new opportunities, while wishing you and your families continued good health and prosperity!
