



Amy McKee



It's the smile that never seems to leave her face. Coupled with a never-say-no positive attitude and an unwavering passion to help her fellow Veterans and chapter members, Amy McKee is a bright light in the success and growth of our Mid-Atlantic Chapter.

Mid-way through her second term on the Board of Directors, Ms. McKee serves as Chapter Secretary, with many organizational responsibilities which keep the chapter running smoothly on a daily basis.

"It's a commitment that I'm really proud of, and it's a humbling experience and an honor to be elected to the board by our members," she says. "I don't take that responsibility and their trust in me lightly."

The pride she takes in her chapter leadership role is only overshadowed by her true calling – a couple of teenagers who call her "mom".

Ms. McKee's daughter Amber is majoring in neuroscience and physics at Virginia Tech, and her son Paul is a junior in high school.

Since her accident in 2006, the strength and closeness of her family have made an incredible impact. "We have all grown together in our new life," says Ms. McKee. "It hit everyone hard, especially the kids, but I wanted them to know right away that it may slow me down a bit, but in no way was it going to shut me down."

Along with her sister Tiffany, Ms. McKee's kids are regulars at Mid-Atlantic Chapter events and functions. Tiffany joined Ms. Kee at the NVWG and assisted our Advocacy & Legislation Team on Capitol Hill this year. "It's great to have them with me at PVA events to see all the work we do and the fun we have," she says. "Being in Washington is something very special for me. Not many people get to meet with members of Congress face to face, and it's meaningful to be a difference-maker for our members, all Veterans, and those with disabilities."

A lifetime U.S. Marine, Ms. McKee was on active duty for 13 years as an aviation electronics specialist. With deployments in Iraq, Afghanistan and Qatar, her primary responsibility was the EA-6B Prowler and other electronic warfare aircraft, being one of few women in that role.

She says that it is important to see women Veterans rally around each other, and that it is especially gratifying to be a leader of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter Women's Council. "We deal with many of the same things as the men who served," she says. "We just have to deal with some of those things a little differently." Ms. McKee is proud of the Women's Council and its influence on the development of a stand-alone Women's Clinic at the Richmond VAMC. "It's good to know that there is a place for us that is adapted to our specific needs."

In between her work with the chapter, family obligations and chasing her 3 dogs, Ms. McKee wants everyone to know that she is always there for our members - so please feel free to reach out. Be assured that you will be greeted by the one-in-a-million Amy McKee smile!
